21 WORTHWHILE PHILOSOPHICAL RAZORS

1. Occam's Razor

9. Narcissim Razor

DONT WORRY ABOUT OTHER PEOPLE'S OPINIONS AS MOST ARE TOO BUSY WORRYING ABOUT OTHER PEOPLE'S OPINIONS OF THEM.

10. Smart Friends Razor
